August 4, 2015

The Board of Directors of the Mojave Air and Space Port duly met for a Regular Meeting at the District Offices in the Administration Building at Mojave Airport, Mojave, California, at the hour of 2:00 o'clock p.m. on Tuesday, August 4, 2015.

The Clerk called the roll and the following Directors were present: Balentine, Deaver, Evans, Painter with Director Peterson on telecom. Also present were District's Deputy General Manager, Karina Drees and Business Manager of Finance, Carrie Rawlings with District's Chief Executive Officer Stuart Witt and District's Counsel, Scott Nave on telecom.

Vice President Evans presented the Agenda and requested that item 3B) under Business Items be removed and placed on the agenda for next meeting. Upon motion by Director Balentine, seconded by Director Painter and unanimously carried, it was:

Motion was made by Director Balentine and seconded by Director Painter. Roll call vote: Ayes: Balentine, Painter, Deaver, Peterson and Evans (5-0).

RESOLVED: That Board approve check numbers 053476 through 053514 in the amount of \$147,072.13 and Electronic Fund Transfer payments in the amount of \$26,964.29 for a total of \$174,036.42.

3C) T-Hangar #958 (Dan Delong)

Deputy General Manager Drees informed Board that Mr. Dan Delong has submitted a proposed bill of sale for Hangar (#958) to Ms. Grace Wang in the amount of \$42,000. In accordance with the terms and conditions of Mr. Delong's lease agreement the District has first right of refusal to purchase hangar. Director Peterson asked if staff had

a recommendation and DGM Drees stated that it has been the practice of the Board to not purchase hangars as they come up for sale and these items are discussed in open session to discuss the new lease terms with the prospective buyer. District Counsel Nave commented that historically these items were placed in closed session under real property negotiations and at some point in time Board gave staff direction to begin discussing the sale of hangars in open session because the Board would rather have the hangars sold to private parties. DGM Drees stated that staff's recommendation is to not purchase the hangar based on the purchase price and rate structure for the T-Hangar area which would preclude the District from recouping its investment in a reasonable amount of time. It was consensus of Board that District decline offer and to allow Mr. Delong to proceed at his discretion to sell the hangar. Motion was made by Director Painter and seconded by Director Balentine. Roll call vote: Ayes: Balentine, Painter, Deaver, Peterson and Evans (5-0).

RESOLVED: That Board exercise its first right of refusal and decline the purchase of T-Hangar 958 from Mr. Dan Delong pursuant to terms of lease dated September 1, 1997.

3D) Resolution relating to Special Aviation Account

Deputy General Manager Drees discussed Resolution amending Administrative Code to remove special aviation checking account. DGM stated that the District currently has two checking accounts at Mission Bank, the General Fund Account and the FAA Special Aviation Fund Account. DGM Drees stated there is no requirement that the District maintain two separate accounts and staff is recommending that District consolidate both accounts into the General Fund Account. DGM also stated that after consultation with FAA the only stipulation is that FAA funds are annotated as restricted funds within the General Fund Account and kept separate from operational funds. Motion was made by Director Balentine and seconded by Director Painter. Roll call vote: Ayes: Balentine, Painter, Deaver and Peterson. Nays: Evans (4-1).

CA sick leave law

MEETING DATE: August 18, 2015

Background:

The State of California has passed AB 1522 granting sick leave to part-time and temporary employees who work 30 or more days per year:

An employee who, on or after July 1, 2015, works in California for 30 or more days within a year from the beginning of employment, is entitled to paid sick leave. Employees, including part-time and temporary employees, will earn at least one hour of paid leave for every 30 hours worked. Accrual begins on the first day of employment or July 1, 2015, whichever is later.

Exceptions: Employees covered by qualifying collective bargaining agreements, In-Home Supportive Services providers, and certain employees of air carriers are not covered by this law.

An employer may limit the amount of paid sick leave an employee can use in one year to 24 hours or three days. Accrued paid sick leave may be carried over to the next year, but it may be capped at 48 hours or six days.

This policy will currently impact the District's temporary fire fighters.

Recommended Action:

Our administrative code will need to reflect the new law and we recommend the Board approve the new language.

Current Sick Leave Policy

Section 2-3.06 Sick Leave

- (a) Persons employed by the District, other than part-time or temporary employees, are eligible for sick leave.
- (b) Eligible employees shall accrue four hours of sick leave for each pay period of continuous service. As used herein, the term "continuous service" shall be deemed to begin on the first day of the month in the event the employee's actual service begins on or before the 15th day of the month and shall be deemed to begin on the 1st day of the following month in the event his service begins on or after the 16th day of the month.
 - (c) Sick leave may be used for any of the following purposes:
 - (1) Emergency or non-emergency medical or dental care;
 - (2) Sickness, provided, employees sick for more than three days must provide the General Manager with a doctor's certificate or other evidence indicating the fact of sickness and that the employee is fit to return to work;
 - (3) Personal hardship, upon the prior approval of the General Manager.
 - (4) Bereavement leave of not more than five days per calendar year.
- (d) Upon retirement, each permanent full-time officer or employee with at least five (5) years but less than ten (10) years of service shall be paid for fifty percent (50%) of accumulated unused sick leave, and a permanent full-time officer or employee with ten (10) or more years of service shall be paid for one hundred percent (100%) of accumulated unused sick leave. The accumulated sick leave shall be paid within thirty (30) days of termination and shall be based upon the officer or employee's salary as of the date of termination.

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF MOJAVE AIR AND SPACE PORT AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 99-1-585 (ADMINISTRATIVE CODE) AS IT RELATES TO SICK LEAVE

Whereas, the State of California has adopted the Healthy Workplaces, Healthy Families Act of 2014 (the "Act") regarding paid sick leave for all California employees, effective July 1, 2015; and

Whereas, the District desires to amend its current sick leave policy to comply with the Act;

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the board of directors of Mojave Air and Space Port as follows:

1. Amendment of Section 2-3.06.

Section 2-3.06 is amended to read as follows.

"Section 2-3.06 Sick Leave

- (a) Persons employed full-time by the District for at least 30 days in a Twelve-Month Period are eligible for sick leave as follows: sick leave shall accrue at the rate of 3.69 hours of paid leave for each pay period. Upon retirement, full-time employees with at least five (5) years but less than ten (10) years of service shall be paid for fifty percent (50%) of accumulated unused sick leave, and full-time employees with ten (10) or more years of service shall be paid for one hundred percent (100%) of accumulated unused sick leave, paid at the employee's salary rate at the time of retirement.
- (b) Persons employed part time, temporary, and per diem (collectively, "Part Time") by the District for at least 30 days in a Twelve-Month Period are eligible for three days or twenty-four hours of sick leave as follows: paid sick leave shall accrue at the rate of one hour for every 30 hours worked. Part Time employees may carry over six days or forty-eight hours of sick leave, but may not use more than three days or twenty-four hours in a Twelve-Month Period regardless of the amount carried over. Unused sick leave will not be paid out at the termination of a Part Time employee's employment with District.
- (c) "Twelve-Month Period" means: (1) July 1 to June 30 for those persons employed by the District on July 1, 2015, or (2) the twelve-month period from their date of hire for those hired after July 1, 2015. If an employee's employment with the District is terminated and that employee returns to work for the District within twelve months of the termination, that employee's sick leave shall be restored as it was at termination.
- (d) Sick leave may be taken 90 days after commencement of employment by the District (sick leave "probationary period") or 30 days of actual work, whichever is later. Sick leave may be used for preventive care or care of an existing health condition of

an employee or the employee's spouse, domestic registered partner, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, or sibling. Sick leave may also be used by employees who are the victim of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking. Full-time employees may use sick leave for bereavement leave, but not to exceed five days in a Twelve-Month Period.

(e) Employees may use paid sick leave upon oral or written request. If the need is foreseeable the employee must give the District reasonable advance notice, but where the need is unforeseeable an employee must give notice as soon as practicable."

Background:

The District's current Compensatory Time Off (CTO) policy includes a maximum 240 of accrued time and no concrete expiration date. In an effort to reduce our liabilities staff would like to reduce the maximum accrued CTO hours to 45 to be used by the end of the fiscal year in which it was earned.

Recommended Action:

Adopt the new CTO policy for the employee handbook and administrative code.

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF MOJAVE AIR AND SPACE PORT AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 99-1-585 (ADMINISTRATIVE CODE) AND EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK AS IT RELATES TO OVERTIME PAY

Whereas, the District desires to amend its current overtime policy concerning compensatory time off;

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the board of directors of Mojave Air and Space Port as follows:

1. Amendment of Administrative Code section 2-3.13.

Section 2-3.13 of the Administrative Code is amended to read as follows:

"Section 2-3.13¹ Overtime Pay

- (a) Regular working hours for permanent employees consist of five consecutive days, forty hours per week, or eight hours per day. A split shift consists of work by permanent employees for five non-consecutive days, forty non-consecutive hours per week, or eight non-consecutive hours per day.
- (b) Full time employees, other than employees exempt under FLSA, who work in excess of their assigned work week shall be paid at a rate of 1.5 times the regular rate of pay for such excess work. Full-time employees who work on holidays shall be paid at twice the normal rate of pay.
- (c) Part-time employees shall be paid at the rate of 1.5 times the normal hourly rate for work in excess of forty hours per week. Part-time employees shall be paid at the rate of 1.5 times the normal hourly rate for work in excess of forty hours per week on a holiday.
- (d) An employee required to return to work unscheduled after a normal shift has ended shall be compensated at the rate of 1.5 times the normal hourly rate and shall receive not less than two (2) hours and not more than four (4) hours worth of compensation regardless of the amount of time actually worked at the rate of 1.5 times the normal hourly rate.
 - (e) Overtime shall be approved in advance by the General Manager.
- (f) At the option of the employee and with the approval of the General Manager, an employee may take time off in lieu of overtime pay. If such compensatory time off is taken, it shall be taken at the rate it would have otherwise been paid as

overtime worked. Compensatory time off shall be taken within a reasonable period after accrual. A non-exempt employee may receive, in lieu of overtime compensation, compensating time off (CTO) at a rate of not less than one and one-half hours for each hour of employment for which overtime compensation is required by law.

- (1) The District will provide CTO under the following conditions:
 - (A) Pursuant to a written agreement entered into between the District and employee before the performance of the work in which the employee requests CTO in lieu of overtime compensation.
 - (B) The employee has not already accrued CTO in excess of forty-five (45) hours.
 - (C) The employee is regularly scheduled to work no less than 40 hours in a workweek.
- (2) (A) An employee may not accrue more than 45 hours of CTO. Any employee who has accrued 45 hours of CTO shall, for any additional overtime hours of work, be paid overtime compensation.
 - (B) If compensation is paid to an employee for accrued CTO, the compensation shall be paid at the regular rate earned by the employee at the time the employee receives payment.
- (3) An employee who has accrued CTO authorized to be provided under subdivision (f)(1) shall, upon termination of employment, be paid for the unused CTO at a rate of compensation not less than the average regular rate received by the employee during the last three years of the employee's employment, or the final regular rate received by the employee, whichever is higher.
- (4) (A) An employee who has accrued CTO authorized to be provided under subdivision (f)(1) shall use that time by the end of the fiscal year in which it was earned. An employee who requests the use of CTO shall be permitted to use the time within a reasonable period after making the request, if the use of the CTO does not unduly disrupt the operations of the District.
 - (B) Upon the request of an employee, the District shall pay overtime compensation in cash in lieu of CTO for any CTO that has accrued for at least two pay periods.
 - (C) For purposes of determining whether a request to use CTO has been granted within a reasonable period, the following factors shall be considered:

- (i) The normal schedule of work.
- (ii) Anticipated peak workloads based on past experience.
- (iii) Emergency requirements for staff and services.
- (iv) The availability of qualified substitute staff.
- (5) This section shall not apply to any employee exempt from the overtime provisions of California law."

2. Amendment of Employee Handbook Section 3.2(e).

Section 3.2(e) of the Employee Handbook is amended to read as follows:

"(e) The use of Compensatory Time Off (CTO) shall be governed by the provisions of Administrative Code section 2-3.13."

3. Effect.

This resolution shall take effect upon its approval by the District Board of Directors. This resolution shall not eliminate any CTO in excess of 45 hours accrued by persons employed by the District upon its passage, but those employees with more than 45 hours of CTO may not accrue any more CTO until their total CTO is less than 45 hours.

4. Other.

Section 1 is amended to add to the Premises an additional 26,625 sq. ft. for parking, as depicted on Exhibit A, attached hereto.

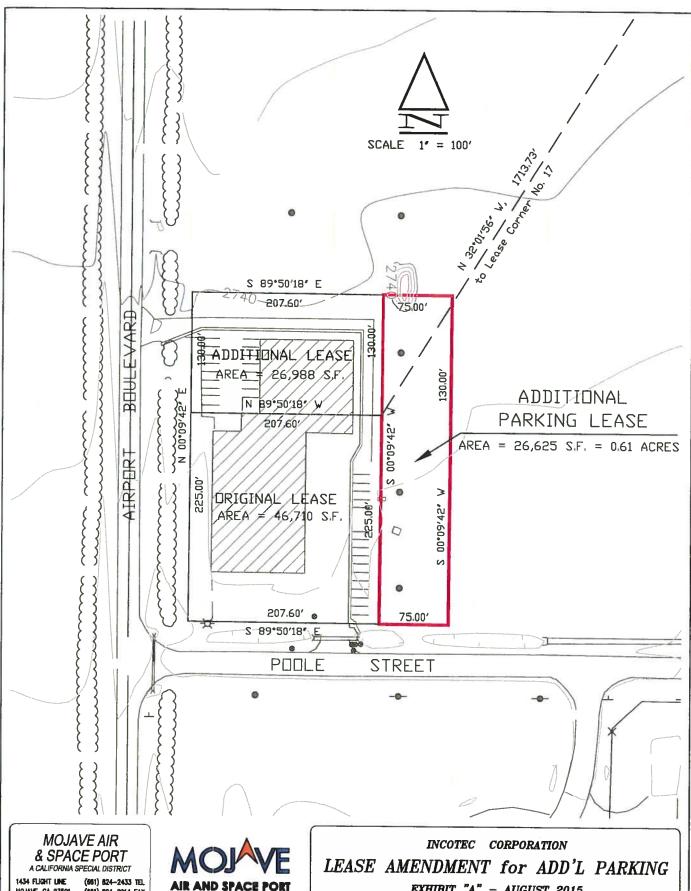
2. Amendment 2, Consideration.
