B. 4. Action Items

A. California City Airport Projects.

CEO Drees briefed the Board of Directors on the remaining balance for the California City Grant and requested she be authorized to approve and pay out the remaining liability not to exceed the \$16,000.00 budget dollars. Upon motion by Director Balentine, seconded by Director Allred, the California City Airport Projects was approved by a 4-1 vote, with Director Parker voting "no".

B. FAA AIP Grant Offer # 3-06-0154-033-2020 Rehabilitation of Taxiway C.

CEO Drees requested authorization to approve and accept the contract for the FAA Supplemental Award of Taxiway C in the amount of \$8,554,706.00. Upon motion by Director Balentine, seconded by Director Allred, the FAA Supplemental was unanimously approved.

C. Resolution Authorizing the Submittal of an Application, Acceptance of an Allocation of Funds and Execution of a Grant Agreement with the California Dept. of Transportation, for an Airport Improvement Program (AIP) Matching Grant. CEO Drees requested authorization to file for and accept the state AIP Matching Grant and authorization to execute the AIP Matching Grant Agreement. Upon motion by Director Balentine, seconded by Director Deaver, the AIP Grant was unanimously approved.

D. Award of Construction Contract for Taxiway C Project.

CEO Drees briefed the Board of Directors on the bids received and requested the Construction Contract be awarded to Granite Construction. Upon motion by Director Allred, seconded by Director Parker, the Board voted unanimously to award the contract to Granite Construction in the amount of \$7,981,258.00.

E. Construction Administration - Taxiway C.

CEO Drees briefed the Board of Directors on the engineering services needed for the Taxiway C Rehabilitation Project and stated the service will largely be paid by the FAA supplemental and entitlement grants. CEO Drees requested the Administration Contract be awarded to Mead & Hunt. Upon motion by Director Deaver, seconded by Director Allred, the Construction Administration contract in the amount of \$847,968.85 with Mead & Hunt was unanimously approved.

MEETING DATE: September 8, 2020

Background:

The District adopted a "use it or lose it" policy for vacation time and allows for a maximum number of 240 hours per employee. Generally, we have enough staff to cover each department and allow for vacation time. However, we are understaffed in our fuels department, and the demand for services has put us in a tough situation for time off.

We have three full-time fuelers in our fuels department. One fueler is on extended leave and his return date remains unknown. Our other two fuelers have been working six or seven days per week to accommodate fueling operations. Any lapse in coverage at this point will mean we are unable to accommodate customer's needs.

Until we know about the return date for the employee on leave, we have been cross-training two of our maintenance crew, but they will not be fully trained until later this year. Our two full-time fuelers have or will exceed the maximum number of vacation hours and I am requesting Board approval to process a partial payout and reduce their vacation balances to 200 as of January 1, 2021. The total payout will be \$6,491.60.

We are transmitting to you for execution the Grant Offer for Airport Improvement Program (AIP) Project No. 3-06-0154-032-2020 at Mojave Air and Space Port Airport in This letter outlines expectations for success. Please read the conditions and assurances carefully.

To properly enter into this agreement, you must do the following:

- a. The governing body must provide authority to execute the grant to the individual signing the grant; i.e. the sponsor's authorized representative.
- The sponsor's authorized representative must execute the grant by providing their electronic signature.

We expect you to submit payment requests for reimbursement of allowable incurred project expenses consistent with project progress. Should you fail to make draws on a regular basis, your grant may be placed in "inactive" status, which will affect your ability to receive future grant offers.

2. Construction project: Submit FAA form 5370-1, Construction Progress and Inspection Report at the end of each fiscal quarter.

WHEREAS, the Sponsor has submitted to the FAA a Project Application dated June 2, 2020, for a grant of Federal funds for a project at or associated with the Mojave Air and Space Port Airport, which is included as part of this Grant Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the FAA has approved a project for the Mojave Air and Space Port Airport (herein called the "Project") consisting of the following:

Rehabilitation of Taxiway C (Design-Only).

which is more fully described in the Project Application.

NOW THEREFORE, According to the applicable provisions of the former Federal Aviation Act of 1958, as amended and recodified, 49 U.S.C. § 40101, et seq., and the former Airport and Airway Improvement Act of 1982 (AAIA), as amended and recodified, 49 U.S.C. § 47101, et seq., (herein the AAIA grant statute is referred to as "the Act"), the representations contained in the Project Application, and in consideration of (a) the Sponsor's adoption and ratification of the Grant Assurances dated March 2014, as applied and interpreted consistent with the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018 (see 2018 FAA Reauthorization grant condition.), (b) and the Sponsor's acceptance of this Offer; and, (c) the benefits to accrue to the United States and the public from the accomplishment of the Project and compliance with the Grant Assurances and conditions as herein provided.

THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE UNITED STATES, HEREBY OFFERS AND AGREES to pay one hundred (100) percent of the allowable costs incurred accomplishing the Project as the United States share of the Project.

This Offer is made on and SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

CONDITIONS

 Maximum Obligation. The maximum obligation of the United States payable under this Offer is \$333,333.00.

The following amounts represent a breakdown of the maximum obligation for the purpose of establishing allowable amounts for any future grant amendment, which may increase the foregoing maximum obligation of the United States under the provisions of 49 U.S.C. § 47108(b): \$ 0 for planning

- \$ 333,333.00 airport development or noise program implementation; and,
- \$ 0 for land acquisition.
- Period of Performance. The period of performance begins on the date the Sponsor formally accepts
 this agreement. Unless explicitly stated otherwise in an amendment from the FAA, the end date of
 the period of performance is 4 years (1,460 calendar days) from the date of formal grant
 acceptance by the Sponsor.

The Sponsor may only charge allowable costs for obligations incurred prior to the end date of the period of performance (2 CFR § 200.309). Unless the FAA authorizes a written extension, the sponsor must submit all project closeout documentation and liquidate (pay off) all obligations incurred under this award no later than 90 calendar days after the end date of the period of performance (2 CFR § 200.343).

The period of performance end date does not relieve or reduce Sponsor obligations and assurances that extend beyond the closeout of a grant agreement.

- 3. <u>Ineligible or Unallowable Costs</u>. The Sponsor must not include any costs in the project that the FAA has determined to be ineligible or unallowable.
- Indirect Costs Sponsor. Sponsor may charge indirect costs under this award by applying the indirect cost rate identified in the project application as accepted by the FAA, to allowable costs for Sponsor direct salaries and wages.
- 5. <u>Determining the Final Federal Share of Costs</u>. The United States' share of allowable project costs will be made in accordance with the regulations, policies, and procedures of the Secretary. Final determination of the United States' share will be based upon the final audit of the total amount of allowable project costs and settlement will be made for any upward or downward adjustments to the Federal share of costs.
- 6. Completing the Project Without Delay and in Conformance with Requirements. The Sponsor must carry out and complete the project without undue delays and in accordance with this agreement, and the regulations, policies, and procedures of the Secretary. Per 2 CFR § 200.308, the Sponsor agrees to report to the FAA any disengagement from performing the project that exceeds three months. The report must include a reason for the project stoppage. The Sponsor also agrees to comply with the assurances which are part of this agreement.

- Amendments or Withdrawals before Grant Acceptance. The FAA reserves the right to amend or withdraw this offer at any time prior to its acceptance by the Sponsor.
- Offer Expiration Date. This offer will expire and the United States will not be obligated to pay any
 part of the costs of the project unless this offer has been accepted by the Sponsor on or before
 September 9, 2020, or such subsequent date as may be prescribed in writing by the FAA.
- 9. Improper Use of Federal Funds. The Sponsor must take all steps, including litigation if necessary, to recover Federal funds spent fraudulently, wastefully, or in violation of Federal antitrust statutes, or misused in any other manner for any project upon which Federal funds have been expended. For the purposes of this grant agreement, the term "Federal funds" means funds however used or dispersed by the Sponsor, that were originally paid pursuant to this or any other Federal grant agreement. The Sponsor must obtain the approval of the Secretary as to any determination of the amount of the Federal share of such funds. The Sponsor must return the recovered Federal share, including funds recovered by settlement, order, or judgment, to the Secretary. The Sponsor must furnish to the Secretary, upon request, all documents and records pertaining to the determination of the amount of the Federal share or to any settlement, litigation, negotiation, or other efforts taken to recover such funds. All settlements or other final positions of the Sponsor, in court or otherwise, involving the recovery of such Federal share require advance approval by the Secretary.
- United States Not Liable for Damage or Injury. The United States is not responsible or liable for damage to property or injury to persons which may arise from, or be incident to, compliance with this grant agreement.
- 11. System for Award Management (SAM) Registration And Universal Identifier.
 - A. Requirement for System for Award Management (SAM): Unless the Sponsor is exempted from this requirement under 2 CFR 25.110, the Sponsor must maintain the currency of its information in the SAM until the Sponsor submits the final financial report required under this grant, or receives the final payment, whichever is later. This requires that the Sponsor review and update the information at least annually after the initial registration and more frequently if required by changes in information or another award term. Additional information about registration procedures may be found at the SAM website (currently at http://www.sam.gov).
 - B. Unique entity identifier (UEI) means a 12-character alpha-numeric value used to identify a specific commercial, nonprofit or governmental entity. A UEI may be obtained from SAM.gov at https://sam.gov/SAM/pages/public/index.jsf.
- Electronic Grant Payment(s). Unless otherwise directed by the FAA, the Sponsor must make each
 payment request under this agreement electronically via the Delphi elnvoicing System for
 Department of Transportation (DOT) Financial Assistance Awardees.
- 13. <u>Informal Letter Amendment of AIP Projects</u>. If, during the life of the project, the FAA determines that the maximum grant obligation of the United States exceeds the expected needs of the Sponsor by \$25,000 or five percent (5%), whichever is greater, the FAA can issue a letter amendment to the Sponsor unilaterally reducing the maximum obligation.
 - The FAA can also issue a letter to the Sponsor increasing the maximum obligation if there is an overrun in the total actual eligible and allowable project costs to cover the amount of the overrun provided it will not exceed the statutory limitations for grant amendments. The FAA's authority to increase the maximum obligation does not apply to the "planning" component of condition No. 1.

The FAA can also issue an informal letter amendment that modifies the grant description to correct administrative errors or to delete work items if the FAA finds it advantageous and in the best interests of the United States.

An informal letter amendment has the same force and effect as a formal grant amendment.

- 14. <u>Air and Water Quality</u>. The Sponsor is required to comply with all applicable air and water quality standards for all projects in this grant. If the Sponsor fails to comply with this requirement, the FAA may suspend, cancel, or terminate this agreement.
- Financial Reporting and Payment Requirements. The Sponsor will comply with all federal financial reporting requirements and payment requirements, including submittal of timely and accurate reports.
- 16. <u>Buy American</u>. Unless otherwise approved in advance by the FAA, the Sponsor will not acquire or permit any contractor or subcontractor to acquire any steel or manufactured products produced outside the United States to be used for any project for which funds are provided under this grant. The Sponsor will include a provision implementing Buy American in every contract.
- 17. Maximum Obligation Increase. In accordance with 49 U.S.C. § 47108(b), as amended, the maximum obligation of the United States, as stated in Condition No. 1 of this Grant Offer:
 - A. May not be increased for a planning project;
 - B. May be increased by not more than 15 percent for development projects if funds are available;
 - C. May be increased by not more than 15 percent for land project if funds are available.
- 18. <u>Audits for Public Sponsors</u>. The Sponsor must provide for a Single Audit or program specific audit in accordance with 2 CFR part 200. The Sponsor must submit the audit reporting package to the Federal Audit Clearinghouse on the Federal Audit Clearinghouse's Internet Data Entry System at http://harvester.census.gov/facweb/. Provide one copy of the completed audit to the FAA if requested.
- Suspension or Debarment. When entering into a "covered transaction" as defined by 2 CFR § 180.200, the Sponsor must:
 - A. Verify the non-federal entity is eligible to participate in this Federal program by:
 - Checking the excluded parties list system (EPLS) as maintained within the System for Award Management (SAM) to determine if the non-federal entity is excluded or disqualified; or
 - Collecting a certification statement from the non-federal entity attesting they are not excluded or disqualified from participating; or
 - Adding a clause or condition to covered transactions attesting individual or firm are not excluded or disqualified from participating.
 - B. Require prime contractors to comply with 2 CFR § 180.330 when entering into lower-tier transactions (e.g. Sub-contracts).
 - C. Immediately disclose to the FAA whenever the Sponsor (1) learns they have entered into a covered transaction with an ineligible entity or (2) suspends or debars a contractor, person, or entity.
- 20. Ban on Texting While Driving.

- A. In accordance with Executive Order 13513, Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving, October 1, 2009, and DOT Order 3902.10, Text Messaging While Driving, December 30, 2009, the Sponsor is encouraged to:
 - Adopt and enforce workplace safety policies to decrease crashes caused by distracted drivers including policies to ban text messaging while driving when performing any work for, or on behalf of, the Federal government, including work relating to a grant or subgrant.
 - Conduct workplace safety initiatives in a manner commensurate with the size of the business, such as:
 - Establishment of new rules and programs or re-evaluation of existing programs to prohibit text messaging while driving; and
 - Education, awareness, and other outreach to employees about the safety risks associated with texting while driving.
- B. The Sponsor must insert the substance of this clause on banning texting while driving in all subgrants, contracts and subcontracts.
- 21. <u>AIP Funded Work Included in a PFC Application</u>. - Assumption of Rights to Civil Remedy Upon receipt of an explanation of a decision not
 to conduct or continue an investigation by the Office of Inspector General, the person
 submitting a complaint assumes the right to a civil remedy under 41 U.S.C. § 4712(c).
- 24. 2018 FAA Reauthorization. This grant agreement is subject to the terms and conditions contained herein including the terms known as the Grant Assurances as they were published in the Federal Register on April 3, 2014. On October 5, 2018, the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018 made certain amendments to 49 U.S.C. chapter 471. The Reauthorization Act will require FAA to make certain amendments to the assurances in order to best achieve consistency with the statute. Federal law requires that FAA publish any amendments to the assurances in the Federal Register along with an opportunity to comment. In order not to delay the offer of this grant, the existing assurances are attached herein; however, FAA shall interpret and apply these assurances consistent with the Reauthorization Act. To the extent there is a conflict between the assurances and Federal statutes, the statutes shall apply. 25. <u>Design Grant</u>. This grant agreement is being issued in order to complete the design of the project. The Sponsor understands and agrees that within 2 years after the design is completed that the Sponsor will accept, subject to the availability of the amount of federal funding identified in the Airport Capital Improvement Plan (ACIP), a grant to complete the construction of the project in order to provide a useful and useable unit of work. The Sponsor also understands that if the FAA has provided federal funding to complete the design for the project, and the Sponsor has not completed the design within four (4) years from the execution of this grant agreement, the FAA may suspend or terminate grants related to the design.

The Sponsor's acceptance of this Offer and ratification and adoption of the Project Application incorporated herein shall be evidenced by execution of this instrument by the Sponsor, as hereinafter provided, and this Offer and Acceptance shall comprise a Grant Agreement, as provided by the Act, constituting the contractual obligations and rights of the United States and the Sponsor with respect to the accomplishment of the Project and compliance with the assurances and conditions as provided herein. Such Grant Agreement shall become effective upon the Sponsor's acceptance of this Offer.
