Runway 8-26

The company will conduct systematic and direct recruitment through public and private employee referral sources likely to yield qualified minority group applicants, including, but not limited to, state employment agencies, schools, colleges and minority group organizations. To meet these requirements, the company will, through the EEO Officer, identify sources of potential minority and female group employees and establish procedures whereby applicants may be referred to the company for employment consideration.
- 3. The company will encourage its present employees to refer minority and female group applicants for employment by posting appropriate notices or bulletins in areas accessible to all such employees.

<u>Personnel Actions</u> Wages, working conditions, and employee benefits shall be established and administered, and personnel action of every type, including hiring, upgrading, promotion, transfer, demotion, layoff, leave of absence, and termination, will be taken without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin or disability. The following procedures will be followed:

- 1. Periodic inspections of project sites will be conducted to ensure that working conditions and employee facilities do not allow discriminatory treatment of project site personnel.
- 2. The spread of wages paid within each classification will be periodically evaluated to determine any evidence of discriminatory wage practices.
- 3. The company will periodically review selected personnel actions in depth to determine whether there is evidence of discrimination. Where evidence is found, the company will promptly take corrective action. If the review indicates that the discrimination may extend beyond the actions reviewed, such corrective action shall include all affected persons.
- 4. The company will investigate all complaints of alleged discrimination in connection with its obligations under its contracts, will attempt to resolve such complaints, and will take appropriate corrective action. If the investigation indicates that the discrimination may affect persons other than the complainant, such corrective action shall include such other persons. Upon completion of each investigation, the company will inform the complainant of its finding and of all avenues of appeal within thirty (30) days of receiving the complaint.

Training and Promotion

- 1. The company will assist in locating, qualifying and increasing the skills of minority and female employees and applicants for employment.
- 2. Consistent with its requirements and as permissible under Federal and State regulations, the company will make full use of training programs, such as preapprenticeship, apprenticeship, or on-the-job training programs, for the geographical area of contract performance.
- 3. To the extent possible, the company will advise employees and applicants for employment of available training programs and entrance requirements for such programs.
- 4. The company will periodically review the training and promoting potential of minority and female employees and will encourage eligible employees to apply for such training and promotion.

<u>Unions</u>. The company will use its best efforts to obtain the cooperation of any unions with which it has collective bargaining relationships to increase minority and female opportunities within the unions, and to effect referrals of minority and female employees by such unions.

1. The company will cooperate with unions, as appropriate, to develop joint training programs aimed at qualifying more minority and female employees for membership in the unions and increasing the skills of minority and female employees so that they may have the

opportunity to qualify for higher paying employment.

- 2. The company will encourage the incorporation of an equal employment opportunity clause into any union agreements stating that such unions will be bound contractually to refer applicants without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, or disability.

The company will provide immediate written notification to the Director when a union with which it has a collective bargaining agreement fails to refer a minority or female, or when the company has other information that the union referral process is impeding its efforts to meet its obligations.

Subcontracting

- 1. When required by federal contract the company will use its best effort to utilize minority group subcontractors, suppliers and vendors. The company, however, reserves the right to determine if the firm is a bona fide Minority Business Enterprise.
- 2. The company will use its best effort to assure subcontractor compliance with equal employment opportunity obligations through monitoring and enforcement of "Section 21 Recourse by Contractor" and "Section 22 Indemnity Clause for Equal Employment Opportunity Violations" contained in Griffith Company's construction subcontract.

Records and Reports

- 1. The company will keep such records as are necessary to determine compliance with its equal employment opportunity obligations. The records kept by the company will be designed to indicate:
 - (a) The number of minority, non-minority and female group member employees in each work classification.
 - (b) The progress and efforts being made (in cooperation with unions, if appropriate) to increase protected group employment opportunities.
 - (c) The progress and efforts being made in locating, hiring, training, qualifying and upgrading protected group employees.
 - (d) The progress and efforts being made in securing the services of minority group subcontractors.

- 2. All such records will be retained for a period of three years following completion of the contract work and shall be available at reasonable times and places for inspection by authorized representatives of the State and Federal governments. The company reserves the right to require these representatives to show proper credentials.
- 3. The company will submit all reports required by Executive Order 11246 and appropriate state and federal agencies, and will permit access to its books, records, and accounts by the appropriate governmental agencies and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with the rules, regulations and orders of the Secretary of Labor promulgated pursuant to Executive Order 11246.

Other Work. The company agrees that it will be bound by the Equal Opportunity Clause required by Executive Order 11246 with respect to its own employment practices when it participates in nonfederal construction work during which time it also has a federally-assisted or direct federal contract.

Assistance in Compliance. The company agrees it will assist and cooperate actively with the appropriate governmental agencies and the Secretary of Labor in obtaining the compliance of contractors and subcontractors with the Equal Opportunity Clause and the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor. The company will furnish such information as may be required for the supervision of such compliance.

Non-Segregated Facilities. All employee facilities provided by the company shall be non-segregated. These include, but are not limited to, rest areas, parking lots, drinking fountains, and all other such common facilities. Background:

Over the past several months MASP has been in negotiations with the Mojave Public Utility District (MPUD) regarding our sewer rates. The Board approved a revised rate structure on April 19, 2016. The contract between the two Districts needs to be amended to bring the terms and rates current. The contract is necessary because MASP is not part of MPUD's district.

Recommended Action:

Approve the amended contract.

AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT FOR SANITATION SERVICE

This Amendment is made by and between MOJAVE AIR AND SPACEPORT, a California Airport District ("Spaceport") and MOJAVE PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT, a California Public Utility District ("Utility District"), as of the date set forth below.

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, a Contract for Sanitation Service and Sanitation Service Fee Agreement was entered into by and between the Utility District and Spaceport under its previous name EAST KERN AIRPORT DISTRICT, and dated April 1, 1991 ("Contract"); and

WHEREAS, the Contract set forth how the Utility District would provide sanitation service to Spaceport subject to the terms and conditions stated therein; and

WHEREAS, Spaceport has two sewer discharge locations from which effluent is discharged into the Utility District's system, the Main 12" connection and the Wash Rack 6" connection; and

WHEREAS, the Contract provides that Spaceport shall pay a Monthly Service Fee to the Utility District as established from time to time by the Utility District (hereinafter "Monthly Service Fee"); and

WHEREAS, the Utility District desires to change the method for calculating the fee under the Contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, incorporating the foregoing recitals, Spaceport and Utility District mutually agree as follows:

1. Section 6 of the Contract is amended as follows:

"6. Service Fee.

The Utility District shall install an outflow meter to record all sewer outflows from the Spaceport on the Main 12" connection. The outflow meter shall be installed by the Utility District at its own cost, and shall remain the property of the Utility District at all times; provided the Spaceport will have access to inspect the outflow meter. Utility District shall be responsible for maintaining the outflow meter, including annual calibration. Utilizing said meter, the Monthly Service Fee for the Main 12" connection will be modified as set forth in Exhibit 1 attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

For purposes of setting the Monthly Service Fee for the Main 12" connection, the Utility District will sample outflow from Spaceport for BOD, TSS and metals once per month on alternating days. Each composite sample will be taken over a 24 hour period. During the calendar year, the days on which samples will be taken, in no particular order,

are as follows: twice on a Sunday/Monday, Monday/Tuesday, Wednesday/Thursday, Thursday/Friday, and Saturday/Sunday and once on a Tuesday/Wednesday and Friday/Saturday. The Utility District, in its sole discretion will select the day on which samples are taken for a particular month so long as samples within a calendar year are taken in accordance with the afore-mentioned schedule. Spaceport shall reimburse the Utility District for all actual, reasonable, and necessary laboratory costs, not to exceed \$200.00 a month, associated with this once-a-month sampling. Samples will be reviewed on an annual basis and adjustments to the pricing structure set forth in Exhibit 1 will be made accordingly. Except for the purpose of setting the Monthly Service Fee, this provision shall in no way alter, limit, or restrict the Utility District's right and authority to sample outflow from the Spaceport as the Utility District, in its sole discretion, deems necessary. In the event results necessitate additional sampling, costs for the additional sampling shall be negotiated and agreed upon by the parties. Notwithstanding this provision, the Utility District reserves the right to change, modify, or amend the calculation and amount of the Monthly Service Fee at the sole discretion of the Utility District, as provided for in Section 6 of the Contract, and as permitted by applicable law.

The Monthly Service Fee for the Wash Rack 6" connection shall be equal to the rates charged for two (2) "small business" and one (1) "car wash" as set forth in the Utility District's adopted rate structure and as may be amended from time to time by the Utility District."

2. Section 7 of the Contract will be added as follows:

"7. Compliance with Rules and Regulations.

The Spaceport shall, at all times, comply with the Utility District's rules and regulations relating to sewer service, as may be amended from time-to- time, and obtain and maintain approvals, licenses, or permits, if any, required by the Utility District, and/or a regulatory agency with appropriate jurisdiction. This shall include, but is not limited to, the Spaceport obtaining an Industrial Waste Discharge Permit, which shall be filed with the Utility District and reviewed on an annual basis."

3. Term.

This term of this Amendment as it relates to setting the Monthly Service Fee shall be through the 2018-2019 fiscal year, or until such time that the Utility District has a rate study completed and amends the sewer service rates for Utility District customers, including the Spaceport. Upon the Utility District's approval of new or modified sewer service rates for District customers, Spaceport shall be subject to the Monthly Service Fee as set by the Utility District and as may be amended from time to time. The rates set forth in Exhibit 1 shall become effective on April 1, 2016 ("Effective Date").

4. Waiver of Proposition 218 Notice and Hearing Requirements.

Pursuant to the amendment made above in paragraph 1, Spaceport and Utility District acknowledge that the methodology used to determine the Monthly Service Fee will be changed from current practices and that an increase in said fee is likely. As said change to the Monthly Service Fee will only affect Spaceport, and no other Utility District customer, Spaceport does

hereby waive and release any notice and public hearing procedural requirements under Prop. 218 relating to changes to the Monthly Service Fee as provided in Exhibit 1, but Spaceport does not waive and expressly reserves any and all other rights and requirements under Proposition 218. Spaceport does not waive or release any procedural or substantive rights, obligations, or requirements under Proposition 218, or other similar law, for any changes in the Monthly Service Fee, or any other fee or rate Utility District may impose or change, subsequent to the Effective Date.
