Expenditures noted on the report for the project include Blueprint Service Company in the amount of \$581.42 and \$4,800.00 for District's consulting engineer David E. Russell. Project as stated previously will be reimbursed by the FAA at a 90% match from FAA and 5% from Caltrans Division of Aeronautics. Upon motion by Director Evans, seconded by Director Balentine and unanimously carried, it was:

3C) SDRMA Resolution

President Peterson presented the SDRMA Resolution which is an annual requirement for the election of Directors to the Special District Risk Management Authority Board of Directors. The SDRMA is a Joint Powers Authority created for the purpose of providing risk management and risk financing for California special districts and other local government agencies. The Resolution for the election of 2015 states four candidates who have met the qualification requirements. Candidates include Robert Swan, Director/President, Groveland Community Services District, Ed Gray (Incumbent) Director/President, Chino Valley Independent Fire District, R. Michael Wright, Director/President, Los Osos Community Services District and Sandy Seifert-Raffelson (Incumbent) District Clerk, Herlong Public Utility District. Selection process can be from one but not more than three candidates to fill the three vacant seats for a term of four years. President Peterson asked if Board members knew any of the four candidates on the SDRMA ballot and all directors responded that they did not know any of the nominees. President Peterson suggested the Board could abstain from casting a ballot. Director Painter suggested that the Board may want to consider the two incumbents on the ballot. Director Evans made motion that Board cast ballot in favor of incumbent Ed Gray Director/President, Chino Valley Independent Fire District and incumbent Sandy Seifert-Raffelson, District Clerk, Herlong Public Utility District. Upon motion by Director Evans, seconded by Director Deaver and unanimously carried, it was:

3D) FY 2015-2016 Preliminary Budget

Deputy General Manager Drees presented the preliminary budget and stated that staff highlighted items that were determined to be unusual for the coming year. These items were presented in a letter from CEO Witt to the Board, in a staff memorandum from DGM Drees and in a staff memorandum from CEO Witt. The letter from CEO Witt states that anticipated revenues and expenses are based primarily on data from the prior fiscal year. The letter also stated that it was difficult to predict anticipated fuel revenues and expenses due to the fluctuating cost of fuel last year. It was also noted in the letter that for the R/W 8-26 lighting project the District has been approved by the FAA for \$300,000 but the actual grant allocation will be determined by which one of three bid options are selected for the project and an increase in scope is possible. The letter states that staff is requesting a 3% increase in employee salaries which will include both merit and cost of living increases. The FY 15/16 budget also reflects a request to spend \$496,000 from District reserves for required infrastructure improvements and employee retention efforts. A 70-year-old pressure reducing valve has been identified for replacement at a cost of \$250,000. Staff is recommending expenditure of \$100,000 for a fitness center for airport tenants on the east end of the event center.

The Staff Memorandum from DGM Drees reflects anticipated revenues for FY 15/16 totaling \$7,767,486 with 58% from rents and leases, 25% from fuel sales and 17% from other sources. Anticipated expenses for FY 15/16 total \$7,818,349 with G&A at 45%, Operations and Maintenance at 31%, 19% for fuel purchases and other at 5% which reflects an operating loss of (\$50,881). Expenses related to Mojave Public Utilities District will have a potential fiscal impact of \$200,000. Staff is anticipating an increase in District's insurance premiums of \$132,000 and additional legal expenses in the amount of \$100,000. Staff has recommended \$50,000 be budgeted for relocation expenses upon

Dear Ms. Drees,

The City of California City is requesting the East Kern Airport District's aid with the disbursement of the \$50,000 dollar annual grant to the City's Municipal Airport which will assist with the maintenance and upkeep of our facility. The grant funds requested are the taxes that are collected from properties within California City through Fund #42950 East Kern Airport District, Tax Area Codes 011-001 thru 011-039 and passed on by the County of Kern through the property tax distribution to the District. California City properties contribute annually, depending on the economy; an average of \$55 to \$59 thousand dollars to the \$200 to \$210 thousand dollars collected in total and passed on to the District.

Please report to the District Board of Directors that this year the airport completed the Runway 06/24 Led Flush Mount Lighting and Signing project under Airport Improvement Program Project No. 3-06-0341-015-2014 for \$282,580. This year we have received authorization to move forward with the rebuild of Taxiway and it's connectors in a two year/two phase effort. FAA Project 03-06-0341-16 for an engineering estimate of 906,267 has been preapproved with the grant award pending. The \$50,000 dollar annual grant will be used for our local match.

Your leadership in the Commercial Space and General Aviation has created an economic engine for the East Kern Region that will continue to be the centerpiece of our road to recovery. The monetary assistance you have provided in years past and future will help us to follow your lead and continue to improve and maintain the aviation system within East Kern.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF MOJAVE AIR AND SPACE PORT TRANSFERRING UNAPPROPRIATED MONEY TO THE CONTINGENCY RESERVE ACCOUNTS, AFFIRMING INVESTMENT POLICY, APPROVING A BUDGET, AND ESTABLISHING THE APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING JULY 1, 2015

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MOJAVE AIR AND SPACE PORT as follows:

1. Contingency Reserves.

The District established contingency reserve accounts for each District fund. The contingency reserve accounts are affirmed. Unexpended monies previously appropriated to any fund of the District, which are not expended as of June 30, 2015, shall be appropriated to the contingency reserve account of each respective District fund. The contingency reserve accounts shall be expended prior to the expenditure of appropriations for the current fiscal year. Contingency reserve accounts shall not be expended to the extent money is being accumulated for emergencies, contingencies, capital projects, or property acquisition.

2. Investment Policy.

The investment policy adopted on May 21, 1985, is affirmed.

3. Budget.

The budget incorporated by this reference as Exhibit A, is approved for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2015.

4. Appropriations Limit.

The appropriations limit of the District under California Constitution Article XIII B for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2015, is \$1,566,608.97.

Staff is presenting the FY 15-16 budget for approval. The budget is based on historical financial data plus anticipated revenues and expenses for the upcoming year. Anticipated revenues for the year are \$7,767,486, which consists of 58% from rents and leases, 25% from fuel sales and 17% from all other revenue sources. The anticipated expenditures for the year total \$8,315,099, including 42% in G&A, 29% in operations and maintenance, 18% in fuel purchases and 11% in all other expense categories, leaving a deficiency of \$(547,631).

The FY 15-16 operating budget primarily includes expenses consistent with recent activity, but there are a few items to note:

- MPUD has informed the District of some additional upcoming expenses due to increased outflow, needs for added meters and soil testing. We will not know exactly what impact this will have on the District until we complete a thorough study with MPUD, but have tripled the water line item for FY 15-16. Additional impact: \$200,000
- The District's insurance premiums continue to climb. Staff is tasked with finding more competitive insurance rates in the coming months. Additional impact: \$132,000
- There are additional legal expenses for FY 15-16 included in the operating budget. Additional potential impact: \$100,000
- We anticipate incurring some additional expense upon hiring a new CEO and have budgeted for relocation expense. Additional impact: \$50,000
- Our network equipment and accounting system need upgrades in order to operate efficiently and increase productivity in the back office. Additional impact: \$43,000
- We are requesting a 3% increase in salaries to include merit and cost of living increases.
 Additional impact: \$41,000
- With our aging workforce and unknown future retirements we intend to keep \$100,000 in the budget annually for reduction in force payouts to account for accrued time off.

In addition to the operating budget there are a number of capital expenditures we are accounting for this year totaling \$496,750. These expenditures include \$396,750 in equipment and infrastructure investments and \$100,000 in tenant retention investments.

We anticipate presenting a mid-year update in January along with a revised budget and potential investment opportunities.



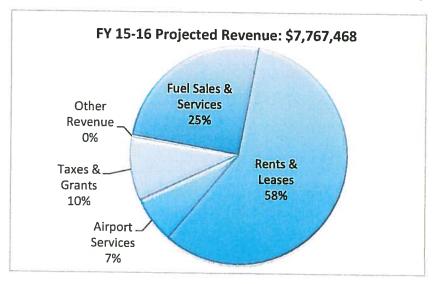

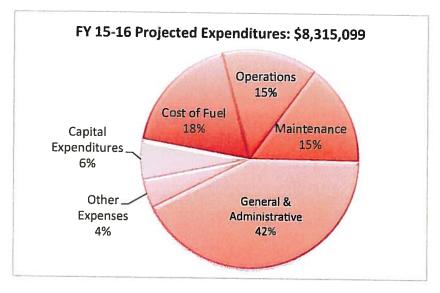

The capital expenditures request for FY 15-16 total \$496,099, which includes:

Vehicle purchase

\$16,750

Runway projects

\$100,000

Infrastructure projects

\$280,000

Tenant retention projects

\$100,000

We currently have commitments for the vehicle purchase and the runway projects. We won a Kern County grant for a Chevy Equinox, which we expect to be delivered in July. The bidding process for our runway 8-26 project is currently underway. Once the final bids are received we will have a better understanding of what the entire project will entail.

The \$280,000 requested for infrastructure projects includes water valve replacements as well as a pressure reducing station. Staff believes these infrastructure improvements are necessary for FY 15-16.

We are requesting the \$100,000 in tenant retention investments to be allocated to a fitness center for FY 15-16.

The above included our recommendations for FY 15-16. Staff evaluated a number of potential projects, which we may recommend to the Board at a future date, including:

AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT FOR SANITATION SERVICE

JUN 1 - REC'D

This Amendment Agreement is made by and between MOJAVE AIR AND SPACEPORT, a special district of the State of California ("Spaceport") and MOJAVE PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT, a California Public Utility District. ("Utility District").

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, a Contract for Sanitation Service and Sanitation Service Fee Agreement was entered into by and between the Utility District and Spaceport under its previous name EAST KERN AIRPORT DISTRICT, and dated April 1, 1991 ("Contract"); and

WHEREAS, the Contract set forth how the Utility District would provide sanitation service to Spaceport subject to the terms and conditions stated therein; and

WHEREAS, the Contract provides that Spaceport shall pay a monthly service fee to the Utility District as established from time to time by the Utility District; and

WHEREAS, it has become necessary for the Utility District to change the methodology of calculating the monthly service fee by installing a meter to facilitate a more proper and accurate monthly service fee in relation to the services being provided; and

WHEREAS, the parties acknowledge that the installation of an outflow meter and change in methodology of calculating the monthly service fee will likely result in an increase in the monthly service fee paid by Spaceport; and

WHEREAS, both Spaceport and Utility District desire to waive, and release any right to, the notice, hearing, and protest requirements that may be required for increasing sanitation service charges under California Constitution Article XIIID, Section 6 ("Prop. 218"); and

WHEREAS, both Spaceport and Utility District desire to amend the Contract to comply with County of Kern Industrial Waste Discharge Permit requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, incorporating the foregoing recitals, Spaceport and Utility District mutually agree as follows:

1. Section 7 of the Contract will be added as follows:

The Utility District shall install an outflow meter to record all sewer outflows from Airport District/Spaceport. The outflow meter shall be installed by the Utility District at its own cost and shall remain the property of the Utility District at all times. Utility District shall be responsible for maintaining the outflow meter. The Utility District will take composite

samples of the Wastewater leaving the Airport District/Spaceport for Biochemical Oxygen Demand ("BOD") and Suspended Solids ("SS"). A monthly service fee will be calculated using the Utility District's Sewer Service Rates, as amended from time-to-time and the: (i) outflow meter's reported "total flow" and (ii) BOD and SS sample results. The Utility District, reserves the right to change, modify, or amend the calculation and amount of the monthly service fee at the sole discretion of the Utility District, as provided for in Section 6 of the Contract.

2. Section 8 of the Contract will be added as follows:

The Airport District/Spaceport shall, at all times, comply with the Utility District's rules and regulations relating to sewer service, as may be amended from time-to-time. This shall include, but is not limited to, obtaining and maintaining an Industrial Waste Discharge Permit, which shall be filed with the Utility District. Said Industrial Waste Discharge Permit shall be reviewed on an annual basis.

- 3. Pursuant to the amendment made above in paragraph 1, Spaceport and Utility District acknowledge that the methodology used to determine the monthly service fee will be changed from current practices and that an increase in said fee is likely. Desiring to reduce the expenditure of funds and time, both Spaceport and Utility District agree to waive any Prop. 218 processes that may be required as a result of the increased monthly service fee, including any notice, public hearing, and protest rights that may exist. As said change to the monthly service fee will only affect Spaceport, and no other Utility District customer, Spaceport does hereby waive and release any right it may have to notice, a public hearing and protest rights under Prop. 218 relating to the changes to the monthly service fee as provided for in this Amendment Agreement. Spaceport also waive any right, claim, or action under Prop. 218 that may exist to challenge the validity of the monthly service fee as changed herein.
- 4. All other provisions of the Contract, not hereby amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
