





We have been making emergency repairs to the hangar 70 roof over the past several years. During each rainy season, we have been spending time and money repairing leaks. Staff would like to make a one-time repair to this roof and prevent future leaks, which will help ensure the customer's property does not become damaged due to heavy rains.

We contacted four vendors and received bids from three:

- IDMS Roofing: \$62,500 for the material and labor, no metal work, no warranty
- T&G Construction: \$76,451 for material, labor, metal work, 10-year warranty
- Central Valley Foam: \$78,000 for material, labor, no metal work, 10-year warranty
- Western Pacific declined to bid

This proposal will seal the roof and provide insulation to conserve energy for the hangar occupant. Staff recommends we hire T&G for this project to complete the seal and warranty the work. If the metal work (i.e. exhaust vents are not removed) is not completed we anticipate additional leaks being a problem in future years.




